Deed Book N, No. 13, 1782-1789 p. 36627 July 1786. Deed. Peter Waples, Sussex, yeoman, from William Waples, Suss. Yeoman. Benjamin Aydelott was seized of a tract called Aydelotts Ignorance which he devised to his dau Rachell Gillstrap wife of Peter Gillstrap which they sold to Paul Waples, father to said William Waples. The said Paul Waples died intestate and the lands (then in Maryland) fell to above mentioned Will Waples. Paul Waples also owned a tract called Aydelotts Neglect of 7 acres which fell to Wm. Waples. In consequence of a bond given by said William Waples to Peter Waples for conveyance dated 23 March 1767 - and a satisfactory sum of money. Attys Wolsey Burton, Rhoads Shanklin, David Train, Phillips Kollock. Wit: William Tingle, Edwd. Dingle. Ackn. 9 May 1787.

Bond of Convenance William Tingle, Sussex, planter, to George Spence of Worcester Co., Planter. George Spence bound to Wm. Tingle to the sum of 1200 , , for 250 acres in Indian River called Thompsons Purchase, being the whole of the tract that formerly belonged to Capt. Thomas Robins before his decease. Wit: Benjamin Purnall, John Evans. Ackn. 8 Aug 1787.

William Tingle, farmer and vocamster? and Elizabeth, his wife of Sussex Co., Del, Baltimore Hundred, to James Fossitt of Worcester Co., Md, 60 pounds, land in Baltimore Hundred the one called Robinson's purchase the other Robinson's Chance, 60 acres, wit Ezekiel Williams, James Miller, 9 Feb 1796.

Luke Tingle and Mary his wife, Sussex Co., and William Tingle 77 pounds 10 shillings, parcel brings part of 3 tracts of land called Assawoman, grant to Wm. Knach, 24 Oct 1677, Robinson's Purchase Robertson's Chance for Michel Robertson will of Annanias Robertson in between William and Luck Tingle. Witness Ezekiel Williams and Thomas Evans 9 Feb 1796.
