FROM OUR DEDICATED STAFF MEMBER IN ONTARIO, CANADA

About "HUGH TINGLE IN ENGLAND," your editor has contacted a professional genealogist in London and asked him to research the Hugh Tingle mentioned therein with the possibility of relating him to the Hugh Tingle who emigrated to Maryland in 1669. Hopefully there will be some results to tell you about in a future issue.

April is the thirteenth generation descendant of Hugh Tingle.

HUGH TINGLE IN ENGLAND

A search of the International Genealogical Index (IGI) at the Utah Genealogical Society gives several Hugh Tinglies in England:

- Lincolnshire - Hugh Tingle, born 10 June 1646 to Symon Tingle in Whitton
- Hugh Tingle, born 13 April 1654 to Symon Tingle and Isabel, in Belton in Axholme.
- London - Hugh Tingle, born 28 December 1662 to Hugh Tingle and Alice in Westminster, St. Paul

It will be interesting to see if any of these prove to be the Hugh Tingle who came to Maryland in 1669. Has anyone done any research on this?

PLANTATION NAMES IN OLD SOMERSET COUNTY

The early settlers of Somerset County, Maryland followed the usual custom of naming both their plantation and other parcels of land. Thanks to the Somerset County rent rolls for 1663 - 1723, we can enjoy some of the more unusual names and appreciate the owner's sense of humor.

Some names reflected the owner's pride: FLOWERFIELD, GREEN MEADOW, CHERRY GARDEN, RICH RIDGE, THE FAIR SPRING, and THE GOLDEN VALLEY were names given to some plantations.

One no-nonsense man called his land COW PASTURE.

Several others were: WOLF'S QUARTER, BEAR RIDGE, and TURTLE SWAMP. Also LYON'S DEN, owned by John Lyon.

Some names anticipated a not-too-promising future: PURGATORY, WORTHLESS, FORLORN HOPE, TROUBLESOME, VAILE OF MISERY, CHEAP PRICE, and one we can all understand, FRUSTRATION.

There must be an interesting story behind CUCKOLD'S DELIGHT.

Others were more positive: GOOD SUCCESS, HAPPY ENJOYMENT, and SATISFACTION. The widow Mary Macraugh called her little plantation MARY'S ADVENTURE.

NOBLE QUARTER was a large plantation; a neighbor named his own, much smaller, property IGNOBLE QUARTER.

And there was WHAT YOU PLEASE (as in "Call it what you please").

★ As mentioned by Seeger Kerns in an earlier article, Hugh Tingle, Sr. owned over 900 acres in five parcels of land: SCOTTISH PLOT (also called LAYFIELD'S LOT), DUMFRIES, PARKER'S DENIAL, HILLIARD'S DISCOVERY, and POWELL'S INCLUSION. It doesn't appear that he chose their names, though, since the first three were purchased from others, and the last two were inherited from his father-in-law Walter Powell.

Some of Walter Powell's other properties were: POWELL'S LOTT, POWELL'S RECOVERY, POWELL'S ADDITION, and POWELL'S MILL POND. (There would be no mistaking who owned that land). Walter also owned GREENFIELD, WINTER QUARTER ON THE SEASIDE, OLIVER'S PORTION, and FRIEND'S GIFT. Walter Powell was a Quaker, one of the "Society of Friends." So it may be that FRIEND'S GIFT referred to his religion.

A GOLD HEADED CANE

A century and a quarter ago, a walking cane emblazoned with an engraved gold heading was 'the thing' for a gentleman to possess.

The photocopy of this particular cane is unusually clear and is reproduced through the courtesy of Mrs. Dolli Tingle Brackett of Westport, CT. It belonged to her great grandfather, Dr. John Perry Tingle of Cambridge, Ohio. The inscription reads; "J. McCulley to Dr. J.P. Tingle, Cambridge, Ohio" and on the side "Battlefield of Shiloh, 13 April 1862."

Dr. Tingle served with distinction in the Union Army during the Civil War. Born 1816 in Cambridge, Ohio, the son of George Roberts Tingle and his wife, Sarah McFarland, he was one of nine children. On 24 March 1840 he married Amanda M. Clark and to this alliance were born three sons and three daughters.

After hostilities ceased, Dr. Tingle practiced medicine in Cambridge until his death on 22 October 1887. Some two years earlier he made his will on 24 August 1885, with a codicil being added 23 March 1887. It named the following children:

John T. Tingle	(m. Rebecca J. McPherson)
Jessie B. Tingle	(m. _____ Scott)
Ann E. Tingle	(m. _____ Brown)
Sarah M. Tingle	(m. Joseph R. Tingle, a second cousin)
Dr. George Todd Tingle	(m. Amanda Shrigley)
William P. Tingle	

Dr. Tingle's will made numerous bequests, to wit:

"I bequeath to my grandson Walter Tingle my gold headed cane with the compass & square";

"I bequeath to my grandson John A. Tingle, my gold headed cane with eyes & tassels."

Of the two canes mentioned in the will, the one pictured in this story would seem to be the cane left to Walter Tingle - but this statement is not made with absolute certainty.

In recent months the cane portrayed herein was found to be in the possession of:

Mr. Lord obtained it from his brother who lives in Port Richey, Florida and is apparently interested in collecting antiques of various types. Neither of these gentlemen is a Tingle descendant but Mr. James Lord, the present owner, is interested in selling the cane.

Who are the two grandsons mentioned in Dr. Tingle's will as being bequeathed the two canes? Walter Tingle would seem to be Walter R. Tingle, born 31 May 1870, the son of Dr. George Todd Tingle. He married Grace _____ about 1897. In the 1920 city Directory of Cambridge, Ohio, he was listed as Chief Clerk of the D.W. Freight Office of the Penn Company (RR), living on Carlisle Street in Newcomerstown, Ohio.

Among our readers there must be someone who can tell us about when Walter R. Tingle disposed of his grandfather's keepsake. Did Walter R. leave children? Who will complete this story?

Then again, perhaps it was John A. Tingle, the other grandson, who inherited the cane pictured herein. Who was the father of this John A. Tingle? One or more of our readers must be able to answer that question.

It is certainly not the purpose of this family newsletter to find buyers for gold headed canes but those descendants of Dr. John Perry Tingle who are among our readers may want to consider whether to contact Mr. James Lord at the address listed. Please keep your editor posted on developments.

ANDREW JACKSON TINGLE

The Spring 1989 issue of the newsletter carried a request from
Gene (Carl G.) Tingle of Sherman, Texas for information about his
great grandfather, Andrew Jackson Tingle.

Very promptly he received a letter from that tireless genealogist,
Mrs. Ann Tingle Lila of Mesa, Arizona, copy of which is reproduced
herein.

On top of that, a new contributor to our newsletter, Mrs. Jo
Ann R. Rice of Orlando, Florida, dug into her files and came up with
a wealth of data from Mr. Richard Warren Tingle of Huntsville,
Alabama. Mrs. Rice's letter is also reproduced herein but due to
lack of space, we'll have to include the rest of the material in a
future issue.

A cursory examination indicates that Andrew Jackson Tingle may ✓
have been a descendant of Littleton, Nathaniel or Kendal Tingle of
Kentucky. Present Tingle descendants in Lawrenceburg and Columbia,
Tennessee, as well as in Kentucky, have identified numerous lines
of descent which will eventually unfold in this newsletter. It is
possible that this very early line of Tingles will lead back to Hugh
Tingle of Maryland.

Regarding your letter in the Spring 1989 issue of the Tingle Newsletter, I submit the following census information which you may already have:

It appears this might be your ancestor although there are a few discrepancies and only initials are used for the first names. J.A. probably should be A.J. Some census recorders were not too precise when taking information back then.

If you have not already found this census, the county seat of Hopkins County is Sulphur Springs. You might find a genealogy section there in the public library which would have this census on microfilm. However, I hear that the Dallas Public Library is a nationally known genealogy research institution and they might have more resources available to you there.

Good luck in your family research. If I can be of further help, let me know.

Dear Gene and J.S. Kerns,

My name is Jo Ann Roempke Rice and as you see, I live in Orlando, Florida. My husband, Bill and I moved to the Orlando area in 1955, to escape the harsh winters of Indianapolis, Indiana. We now have three grown children and two grandsons and still love Orlando. However, we try to go back to Indiana at least once a year to visit my sister and family.

We recently retired from very busy work years and last summer I became interested in Genealogy. Since my father's side was fairly complete, I decided to try my Mother's side, the Tingles. Little did I know when I started the search, that I would become completely devoted, and obsessed by it. I started by writing to as many Tingle families as I could find, from Indiana, Kentucky, Alabama and Fla. Many of them returned with copies of family sheets or pedigrees, etc. All who wrote me were quite eager to help in any way they could. During that period of time, I found three Tingles in the Huntsville, Alabama phone book, at the Holiday Inn, near the Space Museum there. I wrote to them as soon as we returned home from seeing the Museum. Richard W. Tingle of Huntsville, Ala. soon mailed the enclosed records to me. I read them closely and decided that he probably was not connected to our line and filed them away for future use.

I too, am a newcomer to the mailing list of "Tingle Descendants" Newsletter. It is very interesting and quite informative and I believe eventually I will be able to connect my clan to the Delmarva Tingles of Dumfries. But more about that later.

When I read your letter Gene, and saw ANDREW JACKSON TINGLE, B. July 16, 1860, a little alarm rang somewhere in the back of my memory banks. I started searching through my files, notebooks and boxes of records and finally thought of my letter files. BINGO!

As you will notice, Richard was very generous and in your case, very helpful I believe.....I have sent copies to both of you, as some of it might not be interesting to anyone else but Gene and his family. However, I will let J. S. decide that. Isn't this fun!?

I am sure that Richard W. Tingle, Att'y. will be pleased to hear from you and locate more cousins. In fact, he probably would enjoy receiving the "Tingle Descendants" newsletter, if he is not already doing so.

I have been searching for my Great Great Grandfather, Nathaniel Tingle, b.1795, somewhere in Kentucky. In that search, I have collected most of the Tingles in Kentucky from 1790 to 1860.

Nathaniel married Sally Jones in Fayette Co., Ky. in 1822.

(Sally bore six children, 2 boys and 4 girls, before her death, about 1837.) Nathaniel then married Sarah Whitenack of

Mercer County, Ky. in April, 1829. They also had six children, 4 boys and 2 girls. One of those boys, the youngest, born May, 12-

1851, was my Great Grandfather, David Owen Tingle. The entire family, including one daughter from the first marriage, moved on to Johnson County, Pleasant Township, Greenwood, Indiana and began clearing land for a farm. Many of Sarah's married sisters had previously moved to this same area and lived on nearby farms and raised their families and died there. Most of the old pioneers from Mercer County, Ky. are now resting in the Greenwood Cemetery at Greenwood, Indiana. (about 10 miles south of Indianapolis)

I shall not go into names and dates of the remaining generations at this time. Maybe later, when I am able to find another generation or two backwards.

May I possibly obtain copies of the two "Tingle Descendants" that contained the sketches on Hugh Tingle, Sr. and Hugh Tingle, Jr?

I have been researching some in Maryland and Delaware, as several Tingle men in Kentucky records were born in Delaware and Maryland and I still feel there is a connecting point there somewhere.

As was stated in the last issue, the features on the Hugh Tingles were in 1987 Winter issue (Vol. 1-No.2 and the following issue)

Lucille Masson, organist and music teacher, dies

Services for Lucille Tingle Masson, a retired music teacher, organist and choirmaster, will be held at 11 a.m. today at St. Thomas' Episcopal Church, St. Thomas Lane and Garrison Forest Road, Owings Mills.

Mrs. Masson, a Roland Park resident for many years, died Monday after a long illness at Roland Park Place, where she had lived for about five years. She was 87.

She retired about six years ago, having taught piano students at her home since 1969.

Before that, she also taught at the Towson branch of the Peabody Institute and at the Garrison Forest School.

She retired in 1961 after teaching music in Baltimore schools for 41 years. She also taught courses in music instruction at the Peabody Conservatory, and taught voice and directed the glee club at Trinity College in Washington.

Before her final retirement, she

was organist and choir director at the Episcopal Church of the Nativity in Cedarcroft for six years. For 25 years before that, she worked at St. Thomas' Church and at St. John's Episcopal Church in the Worthington Valley.

Born in Baltimore, the former Lucille Tingle was educated at Western High School, Johns Hopkins University and the Peabody Conservatory, earning a bachelor's degree and two master's degrees in music.

She was a member of the Three Arts Club of Homeland, the Woman's Club of Roland Park, the Baltimore Music Club, the Opera Guild, the Chesapeake chapter of the American Guild of Organists and the Baltimore Country Club.

Her survivors include three nephews, William B. Gwyn of New Orleans, C. Pearce Coady of Royal Oak and the Bahamas and John T. Coady of St. Michaels; and a niece, Deborah Kormuth of Monkton.

Mrs. Masson came by her vocation quite naturally. She was the daughter of John Paul Tingle of Baltimore and his wife, Deborah Ann Barnes. Mr. Tingle, who before his death in 1964 at age 88, was choir-master in Baltimore Episcopal churches for 43 years and had taught more than 1,500 boys to sing.¹

She was married 23 October 1924² to Stevenson Masson at the Cathedral Church of the Incarnation by the Very Reverend John Gardner Murray, presiding bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church of Maryland. The Massons were divorced in January 1941.³ There were no children.

Dear Mr. Kerns:

I truly appreciate your agreeing to print a query for me in your Tingle Newsletter. I'm keeping my fingers crossed that it will produce positive results.

John M. (?) Tinkle was born c. 1790. He was a private in the War of 1812 from Rowan County, NC. In 1813 he married Johanna Burrige in Rowan County. Apparently she died within a few years. In January, 1820 he married my ancestor, Sarah Browning, in Madison County, Alabama, although he was actually living in Bedford County, Tennessee. The 1820 Bedford County, Tennessee census shows him with small children in his household, apparently from the marriage to Johanna Burrige. I cannot find out where he was born. I have been unable to determine the origin of the name "Tinkle". No record exists of that name prior to 1790, when a George Tinkle married in Gibson County, Tennessee. If anyone has any information at all regarding John Tinkle of Rowan County, NC, I would deeply appreciate it.

SOLOMON TINGLE OF CRAVEN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

In this issue of the newsletter we reproduce six family group records and six pages of Tingle genealogy through the courtesy of Mrs. Daisy Freeman Duncan, Lawrenceville, Georgia. The family groups are:

Solomon Tingle
John Tingle (one of Solomon's 3 children)
Daniel Tingle (one of John's 8 children)
McCarroll Tingle (one of Daniel's 11 children)
Frances Parthenia Tingle (one of McCarroll's 4 children)
James Lafayette Tingle (another of Daniel's 11 children, who married twice and had 8 children by each wife)

As a young girl, Mrs. Duncan frequently listened to her grandmother, Frances P. Tingle Smith, talk about family history. Many of us have had similar experiences with our parents and grandparents, but with a difference. Daisy didn't just listen - she wrote down what she heard. She was only a child of about 14. There is a lesson here to be learned by today's grandparents and parents.

As Daisy advanced in age and knowledge, she learned how and where to search records in order to substantiate what she had heard by word of mouth. Of such determination are genealogists born!

Mrs. Duncan and her husband, Bob, celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary this past February. She has helped many of our newsletter readers to develop and refine their own respective Tingle lines of descent. The one ancestor we are talking about here is Solomon Tingle of Craven County, N.C. whose will was probated in March 1795.

SOLOMON TINGLE OF CRAVEN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA (continued)

Through the many charts that have flowed into the files of the family newsletter since its inception two years ago and which relate to the Solomon Tingle line, your editor at this writing, has delineated 10 generations embracing 439 Tingle descendants. There must be two or three times this many names remaining to be identified which are hidden in Bibles, desks, trunks, attics, etc. The magnitude of the task is self-evident. Remember, we are talking about only one strain of Tingles - Solomon Tingle - who helped to populate the southern part of the U.S. There appear to be ten other lines of Tingles whose interconnection has yet to be proved.

Thank you, Mrs. Duncan, for sharing your memoirs with so many of the 'extended Tingle family.' The remaining six pages of your genealogy will be reproduced in the next issue of the newsletter.
