JOHN AND SARAH (SALLY) MESSICK TINGLE
OF MARYLAND AND MISSOURI (1780-1851)

John Tingle was one of the twelve children of Caleb Tingle (ca 1730-1797) and Elizabeth Fassitt Tingle (ca 1734-1806), both born in Somerset County, Md. The area in which they were born became Worcester County in 1742. John was, therefore, a great grandson of Hugh Tingle, the progenitor of this branch of Tingles in Maryland.

The birth of John Tingle was recorded in the "Register of St. Martin's in Worcester Parish", the date being 13 April 1780.¹

His father, Caleb, died in 1797 and in his will left numerous bequests to his children. John received part of the ancestral land including the house where his father lived.²

On 7 Jan. 1801 a marriage license was issued to John Tingle and Sarah Messick at the Worcester County Courthouse in Snow Hill, Md.³ He was not quite 21. Her date of birth is estimated as 1784.

Some six years later, 27 Feb. 1807, John and Sally Tingle sold 67½ acres of the land he had inherited, then known as DOUBLE PURCHASE, to his brother, Daniel.⁴ And - on 8 Nov. 1809 John Tingle sold 158 acres of GUNSHOT RIDGE to another brother, William. On the same day this tract was resold by William to Sarah Tingle, wife of John.⁴

In April 1837 John and Sarah (Sally) Tingle left Maryland for Missouri, settling in Shelby County the following month. Apparently most, if not all, of the children, married and single, came with them.

The married life of John and Sally Tingle was evidently not always peaceful. On 12 August 1839 she filed a bill of complaint for divorce with the Clerk of the Circuit Court in Shelby County, Missouri. The petition, submitted at the Nov. 1839 term of court, stated "that she has resided in the State of Missouri more than two years during which time her husband has been a notorious drunkard and has treated her with insult, indignity and abuse", etc.⁵ I refrain from quoting further details of this public record. I could not find a record of the divorce being granted, so I retained Ms. Teresa L. Blattner of Fulton, Missouri, a professional genealogical researcher, to investigate further. She reported as follows:

"I find it very unlikely that Sarah ever got her divorce. Sad as her life must have been, she did not have grounds for a divorce in Missouri during this time frame. It was considered a husband's right to beat his wife and children any time he wanted. Another thing is that he did not have to support them."

"The only grounds for divorce were: infidelity, desertion and habitual drink. And even with that, the situation had to continue for two years. In other words, the spouse could take off for a year and 363 days and come back home, and it was not considered desertion. They could also stay drunk as much as they wanted, as long as they were sober one day out of two years."

JOHN AND SARAH (SALLY) MESSICK TINGLE (continued) ...

The date of death for John Tingle has not been ascertained but on 13 Aug. 1851 the will of Sarah Tingle was filed for probate in Shelby County, Missouri. The will was made on 3 July 1851 and the name of John Tingle, her husband, is not mentioned.

John and Sally Tingle were the parents of eleven children. Their names are listed below, not necessarily in the order of birth. Here is what is known about them at this writing:

1. TINGLE, G.W. - (initials may stand for George William or George Washington); died before 1851 - his name is not mentioned in his mother's will. He left two minor children whose name and whereabouts are unknown.
2. TINGLE, WILLIAM S. - born 1812; died prior to July 1851 when his will was entered for probate in Marion County, Missouri. Married Julia Ann _____; had two children - Mary Adelaide, b. 1847 and Ellen, b. 1848. The 1850 census for Hannibal, Marion Co., Mo. lists his occupation as 'teamster'.
3. TINGLE, MARTHA - she was first married to Elisha Powell per marriage license issued 7 Jan. 1825 in Worcester County, Md.³ Four sons were born to this marriage: G.W. Powell, John Powell, James Powell and Stephen Powell. After their father's death, Martha married John Davis. They had two children: David Davis and Ruth Davis. Martha Tingle Powell-Davis apparently died before July 1851 when her mother made her will, as her name is not mentioned.
4. TINGLE, HESTER ANN - known as 'Hetty'; she was born ca 1810 in Maryland.⁵ On 2 March 1830 a marriage license was issued in Worcester County, Md. to Selby Rain and Hetty Tingle³. Seven children were born to this marriage: Sarah, Elizabeth, Nancy, John, Frances, Martha and George. The first three were born in Maryland, while the last four were born in Missouri.⁵ Selby Rains's occupation was listed as 'laborer' and he owned real estate valued at \$400.
5. TINGLE, JUDEA CATHERINE - born ca 1813 in Md. On 12 April 1831 she and Solomon Evans secured a marriage license in Worcester County, Md.³ Eight children were born to this marriage: Sarah, John N. and Mary E. were born in Maryland⁵, while Rufus L., Martha C., Charlotte C., Louisa D. and Caleb G. W. were born in Missouri⁵. Solomon Evans occupation was given as 'farmer' on the 1850 census for Shelby Co., Mo. with real estate valued at \$400.⁶
6. TINGLE, LOUISA - born ca 1804 in Md. On 30 Aug. or 30 Oct. 1837 she married John T. Lister in Shelby Co., Mo. He was a widower, born 12 May 1803 in Worcester County, Md. who had previously been married to Louisa Truitt of Worcester Co. in 1829 or 1830.³ They emigrated to Missouri where she died 11 Jan. 1837. John T. Lister and his second wife, Louisa Tingle, were parents of seven children, all born in Missouri.⁷

Retired minister Melvin E. Tingle, 76

SALISBURY, Md. — The Rev. Melvin E. Tingle, 76, a retired United Methodist minister, died Friday of heart failure in Peninsula Regional Medical Center, Salisbury.

Mr. Tingle moved to Beaglin Park Drive, Salisbury, from Lewes, Del., after his retirement several years ago.

During his 30-year career, Mr. Tingle was pastor of United Methodist churches in Clarksville, Del., Oxford, Damascus and, earlier, in the Baltimore area and South Carolina.

He was a member of Bethesda United Methodist Church, Salisbury, and Pastoral Care Ministry at Peninsula Regional Medical Center.

An Army veteran of World War II, he served in China, Burma and India.

He graduated from Bob Jones University, Greenville, S.C.

His wife, Marguerite, died in 1986. He is survived by several aunts and cousins.

A service will be at 1:30 p.m. Monday in Melson Funeral Services, Long Neck Road, Millsboro, where friends may call after 12:30 p.m. Burial will be in Henlopen Memorial Park, Milton.

Instead of flowers, the family suggests contributions to Bethesda United Methodist Church, Salisbury.

The Rev. Melvin E. Tingle was one of three children born to Harley Lee Tingle (1866-1961) and his wife, Pearl Ivey Quillen (1891-1973). This line of Tingles traces its origins back to Elisha Willard Tingle (1867-1941), Manaan Tingle (1830-1915), William Tingle (1804-) and James Tingle (ca 1764-1848) who married Leah Lockwood. A story on some members of this family appeared in 'TINGLE DESCENDANTS', Vol. 4- No. 1, pp. 18 - 20. The initial records show them living in Sussex County, Delaware, then moving across the state line to Worcester County, Md. This part of Worcester became Wicomico County in 1867.

However, James Tingle apparently removed from Delaware to Eaton, Preble County, Ohio, early in the Nineteenth Century with one of his sons. Yet, the one, William, mentioned above, remained close to his roots in Del/Md. The Rev. Melvin E. Tingle was the great-great-grandson of this William.

A MYSTERY WAITING TO BE SOLVED !
JOHN THOMAS TINGLE OF MISSOURI (1818-1899)

Who can help your editor to identify JOHN THOMAS TINGLE?

The 1860 census for Black Creek Twp., Shelby County, Missouri, taken 6 July 1860, lists family No. 383 as:

TINGLE, JOHN THOMAS, age 39, b. Maryland
TINGLE, ELIZABETH, age 27, b. Maryland

I need to know the name of the father of JOHN THOMAS TINGLE. Data developed by Teresa L. Blattner, excellent researcher of Fulton, Missouri, shows the following family data:

John B.'s estate is #3430, Shelby Co. It names only one child, Mrs. Myrtle Tingle Taylor, wife of Clifford Taylor

SAMUEL TINGLE OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NAVY!

Our faithful staff member from Texas, Jackie Goldman, has uncovered another Tingle 'find'. This one involves SAMUEL TINGLE, and the record came from the Pennsylvania Bureau of Archives and History in Harrisburg, Pa.

The first document shows that SAMUEL TINGLE, rank listed as able seaman, served in the Pennsylvania Navy on the Arnold Battery, commanded by Captain Sam Davison from March 15 to May 1776. (Taken from a Muster Roll of the Arnold Battery, June 1, 1776).

The second document records that SAMUEL TINGLE, rank listed as able seaman, served in the Pennsylvania Navy on the Montgomery from July 1, 1776 to February 1777, at which time his death was noted as February 1777. The ship was under the command of 1st Lt. Francis Feariss from July to October 1776, and after that by Cap't. Henry Dougherty. (Taken from the Muster Rolls of the Montgomery, July 1776 to February 1777).

These interesting documents prove that SAMUEL TINGLE served in the Revolutionary War. Thus he joins GEORGE TINGLE of Virginia (Vol. 6 - No. 4 - "TINGLE DESCENDANTS" newsletter) as the second TINGLE to serve the American cause for independence.

The question now posed is - "Who is this SAMUEL TINGLE?" How old was he at the time of his death in Feb. 1777? Who were his parents? Was he married and did he have children?

It seems most likely that he was from Delaware. Research is continuing but in the meantime if any of our readers have clues, please send them to Mrs. Jackie Goldman at her new address which is: 15 Grogan's Point Court, The Woodlands, Texas 77380

JESSE TINGLE OF KENTUCKY (1799 - 1854)

By now our readers know that when staff member, Jody Rice of Orlando, FL, sets her sights on an elusive, long lost Tingle Ancestor, it is only a matter of time until facts of his or her life are unearthed. This also applies to any descendant. Such is the case with JESSE TINGLE of Kentucky, very likely the son of JASPER TINGLE, born 1764/65 in Maryland. The latter's name appears on the 1790 Reconstructed Census of Delaware, when he was living in Baltimore Hundred of Sussex County. Detailed reference was made to JASPER in "TINGLE DESCENDANTS", Vol. 6 - No. 4, pp 7 - 18.

The following article by Mrs. Rice was prepared by her in August 1992, but due to lack of space in our family newsletter, we have been unable to publish it sooner. It is a splendid example of detailed and time-consuming genealogical research. Our thanks and congratulations to her! Seventeen pages of supporting documents, ancestor charts and family group listings accompanied this article. Only lack of space precludes us from publishing them at this time.

JESSE TINGLE continued...pp 10 to 18

JESSE TINGLE, was born December 14, 1799, probably in Fayette County, Kentucky. He was very likely, the eighth child born to JASPER TINGLE, born 1764-65, Maryland, and his wife (), unknown to date.

I first located Jesse, listed as a tax payer, of over 21, and living in Woodford County, Ky., along with other Tingle men, living in the same area.....I had been finding a JEPE TINGLE, in census records and a mortgage record of Scott County, Ky. Eventually, I was informed that a "P" was used, in old script, to indicate double esses. A practice used by German scribes, that was carried over, into the new country, and used quite often, in the early records of the 18th and 19th centuries.

Jesse married SARAH C. PLUNKET OR PLUNKETT, February 2, 1824, Lexington, Fayette Co., Ky. She was the daughter of REUBIN PLUNKET, as shown on their marriage bond record. A JOHN PLUNKET acted as bondsman.....SARAH C. PLUNKET TINGLE, was born on July 15, 1801 in Kentucky.

On November 11, 1824, JESSE TINGLE & JAMES JOHNSON, signed a mortgage, agreeing to make \$100.00 payments, every four months, for 5 years, which might be discharged by the payment of \$25.00 worth of spun cotton, delivered to JOEL SCOTT, each month, until the balance of \$1,500.00 was paid. Jesse and James were buying equipment and building, to start their own cotton factory. Some of the equipment, was 4 Throstles and 1 Rell, plus 6 Cormes..... A Throstle, was a form of spinning machine, in which the thread is spun from roves, by the continuous operation of a set of drawing rollers, with bobbins and fliers. So named from the humming sound it makes....I'll let you use the dictionary for the others!.....The above mortgage was drawn and signed, in Scott County, Ky. Payments to begin on 22 Nov., 1824.

I have no further information concerning the cotton factory, or the equipment. However, Jesse appeared on a Woodford County, Ky. tax list of 1825, along with Jasper, David and Nathaniel Tingle. (Nathaniel was my great-great-grandfather)....All were living in Woodford County, at Versailles, and Nathaniel and David Tingle were partners of lot #66, with two residences and a cotton factory. It appears that Jasper and Jesse Tingle, had moved to Mortonsville, near Versailles, KY., in Woodford County, to join the family. A tax list, the following year, in the same area, did not list Jesse, but Jasper stayed, at least 4 more YEARS.

The 1830 census of Woodford Co., KY., p.333 of microfilm, shows Jasper Tingle and his wife, ages 60 to 70 years, with 1 male, 30 to 40 years old, 1 female, 20 to 30 years old, and two children, 1 male, under 5 years, and 1 female, 5-10 years...Since Jesse Tingle was not listed on the index of that census, I feel sure that he was the 30-40 year old male, above, and the 20-30 year old female, was his wife. Likewise, the two children were most likely theirs. Those children, were later identified as, JOHN P. TINGLE, b. 1825, Ky., and AMANDA TINGLE, b. 13 Sep. 1826, Ky.....This record, was the last one of Jasper Tingle and his wife, so I think they probably died in Woodford or Jessamine Co., Ky.

TINGLE DESCENDANTS continued . . .

In 1840, "JEPE" TINGLE was in Jessamine County, KY. The census enumeration of Jesse and family, was shown on p.223, of Micro Copy No. M704, Roll No. 116, R.G.312-UNI. The family was listed as follows;

- JEPE TINGLE, age 40-50 (b.1799, Ky.)
- 1 female, age 30-40 (b.1801, Ky.) =(SARAH C.PLUNKET TINGLE)
- 1 male, age 15-20 (b. 1825, Ky.)=JOHN P. TINGLE)
- 1 male, age 10-15 (b. 1828, Ky.)=JESSE TINGLE, JR.)
- *1 male, age 5-10 (b. 1830-35)-?
- 1 male, age under 5 (b. 1835-40)-?
- *****
- 1 female, age 20-30 (b. 1810-1820)-?
- 1 female, age 10-15 (b. 1826, Ky.)=AMANDA TINGLE)
- *Note: ANN M. TINGLE, born ca. 1830, was not accounted for, unless an error was made, and she was listed as a male.

The two slaves, were: 1 male, age 10-25, and 1 female, age 36-55, making a total of 10 persons accounted for, with 5 in agriculture.

Jesse Tingle and Sarah C. Plunket Tingle, were not listed in the census index of 1850, in Kentucky, as far as I have been able to determine. Perhaps they were living with one of their children, that I have not yet discovered.....Jesse Tingle died on 15 Oct. 1854, at age 55, and was buried in Section I, lot #15 of the Lexington Cemetery, on Main St., Fayette County, Ky....His wife, Sarah Plunket Tingle, lived another decade, outliving her husband by eleven years. It now appears, that Sarah married again, to a YOUNG. However, when she died, she was buried near Jesse, in the Lexington Cemetery, on Main Street, Fayette County, KY. She died 10 March, 1866, at age 65.

The 1850 census of Lexington, Fayette County, KY., index, shows the name AMANDA TINGLE, twice, Fayette County, p.142 District. The microfilm was very difficult to read, but it was clear enough to make out the names of AMANDA and her sister, ANN M. TINGLE. Amanda was 23 years old and Ann was 19.....They were among several young women, of the same age group, headed by a man and woman, (names were not legible). He was a Silversmith by trade, and she was a Seamstress. It appears to be a school or home for girls.....The girls had no occupation, so I am assuming it was a school.

The first child, born to Jesse Tingle and Sarah C. Plunket-Tingle, was JOHN P. TINGLE, b. 1825, Kentucky, probably in Woodford County.....A John Tingle, age 35, in the 1860 census, was living in Scott County, Ky. He was by trade, a Weaver and Hames maker.....A marriage, for a JOHN TINGLE, to MARY BARNHILL, took place on 30 March, 1843, in Scott Co., KY..#489. married by P.H. Whitton.He was buried in the Lexington Cemetery, near the other members of his family, @ age 61. I believe that age is incorrect. He died 8 May, 1891, Fayette Co., Ky. AMANDA TINGLE was the second child of Jesse and Sarah Tingle, being born on 13 Sept., 1826, in Kentucky, probably Woodford Co.; or Jessamine Co.....She married WILLIAM TINGLE, JR., on the 12th of May, 1853, in Lexington, Fayette County, Ky. Their

marriage license was issued on the 11th. Amanda's age was attested to, by her father, JEPE TINGLE. They were married by W. C. DANDY, Minister of M.E. Church, South, in the presence of D.F. WINCHESTER and I. TWEEDIE.....Amanda was nearly 27 years old, and her husband was a few months younger. He was born 17th of December, 1826 in Kentucky. His parentage is not known..... I suspect that he may be the son of one of Jesse's brothers. If that turns out to be true, then Amanda and William, Jr., were first cousins.....I had hoped to prove his parents, by his death certificate, but that didn't happen. The clerk of Fayette County, that copied it for me, added a note, saying that no other information was given.....I have also searched the 1850 census records of most of the Tingle families of Henry County, and surrounding counties, to find William, jr., at age 23, with his parents. No luck!

The 1860 Census of Fayette County, in Lexington, Ky., p.579 of the microfilm, listed the following Tingles:

WILLIAM TINGLE, age 34, owned \$500.00 worth of Real Estate and was worth \$100.00 personal property. He was shown as being a Carpenter, at that time.

AMANDA TINGLE, age 34, was keeping house.

MARY E. TINGLE, age 6, born in Kentucky ? Fayette Co.
EMMA TINGLE, age 3, born in " "
ELIZA TINGLE, age 2, born in " "
WILLIAM TINGLE, age 7/12, born in " "

Ten years later, the 1870 census enumeration, of the same family, on page 72, (in the upper left corner of the record), listed the following;

#29-WILLIAM TINGLE, age 43, Male, white, Ret. Grocer, born in KY., worth \$1100.00 in Real Estate and \$250.00 personal worth, and he was checked as a Citizen of U.S.

#30-AMANDA TINGLE, age 43, female, white, keeping house, & born in KY.

#31-MARY E. TINGLE, age 16, female, white, attending school.

#32-EMMA TINGLE, age 14, female, white,

#33-ELIZA TINGLE, age 12, "

#34-LAURA TINGLE, age 9, " "

#35-ERNEST TINGLE, age 6, male, white

#36-LEONARD TINGLE, age 4, " "

#37-LEE TINGLE, age 2, " "

** WILLIAM TINGLE, (III), born 20 Nov., 1859, KY., was not listed with his family, above. He would have been 10 years old, so I believe it must have been an error, that he was excluded.....He later married a girl named ANNIE ()

and they had at least one child, JAMES H. TINGLE, b. 18th of April, 1884, Lexington, Fayette, KY.

This WILLIAM TINGLE, (III) took over his father's Grocery, and remained in Lexington, KY.....He died 4 Dec., 1915, from Edema of the Lungs, with Pneumonia. Contributing to his death, was Exposure. He was buried on the 5th of Dec., 1915, in Section 11, Lot 56, in the Lexington Cemetery, in Lexington, Fayette Co., KY.....At the time of his death, he and his wife, Annie, were living at 377 E. Third Street, Lexington, KY.....I was not able to find a marriage record for this couple, and I have not read the more recent census, of this couple, after 1870. There were probably more children.....Their son, James H. Tingle, mentioned above, was only 23 years old at the time of his death, on Sept. 5, 1907. He is also resting in the same, Section 11, Lot 56, with the others of his family.....His mother, Annie () Tingle, was not buried near her husband and son.

The third child of Jesse and Sarah C. Tingle, was JESSE, JR., born 1828, in Kentucky. I did not look for a marriage record for him, because I found that he had died at age 36, on 24th of July, 1864, and was buried in the Lexington Cemetery, in Section I, Lot #15, interment on the 25th. Cemetery records identified him as the son of Jesse and Sarah C. Tingle.

The fourth child of Jesse and Sarah C. Tingle, was ANN M. TINGLE, born 1830, Kentucky. She never married, and lived many years with her sister Amanda and family. Ann M. Tingle died on July 1, 1896, at age 66. Cemetery records of Lexington, listed her as Miss Ann Tingle, Section 15, lot 40, S.E. 1/4, Lex., Ky. She was interred on the 1st of July, so she probably died on June 30th.

The fifth child of Jesse and Sarah C. Tingle, was EDWARD D. TINGLE, born on the 26th of December, 1840, in Kentucky, probably in Jessamine County....Edward did not reach maturity. He died at age 11 1/2, on June 16, 1852, and was buried in Sec. I, Lexington Cemetery, Main St., Lexington, KY., Fayette County. Edward appears to be the last child born to Sarah Tingle, and Jesse, sr.

Returning to AMANDA & WILLIAM TINGLE, JR., they remained in Lexington, Kentucky, living at 214 North Lime St., at the time of William's death, in 1900. When Amanda Tingle died in 1907, she lived at 416 Limestone.....Through the years, starting in 1826 to 1901, several of the Lexington, Kentucky, Tingles, had many Deed and Mortgage transactions, between family members and others. I have a lengthy, index record, of all Tingle transactions, in Fayette County, Ky., 1794 to 1903. Also, I have copies of eight of those original records, pertaining to the transactions between family members, etc....I will gladly make copies, to send to interested, members of "Tingle Descendants".

Continuing with the identification of Amanda & William Tingle's family, as I know them, they are;

Mary E. Tingle, never married, and remained at home with her parents. Amanda, her mother, signed over their home to Mary, in 1900, in exchange for taking care of the home and her mom, during her remaining years. That became seven years, as Amanda died of Organic Heart Disease, on March 31, 1907, at age 80½. She was buried on April 1, 1907, in Section J, Lot 112, Grave W½. Her death certificate states that she was 80 years, 6 mos. & 18 days old at her death. The attending Physician, was DR. DAVID BARROW, her parents were JESSE TINGLE & SARAH YOUNG; cause of death is shown above.....Daughter, Mary, died Feb. 25, 1927, at age 74, Lexington, Fayette Co., KY., and was buried in Section 15, Lot 40, in the same, Lexington Cemetery.

The second child of Amanda and William Tingle, Jr., was EMMA TINGLE, born 1857, in Lexington, Fayette Co., Ky. She never married, and also lived at home, until her death in the year 1925, on 13th of August. Emma was also buried in the Lexington Cemetery, in Section 15, lot #40. She was 74.

The third child of Amanda and William Tingle, Jr., was ELIZA TINGLE, born ca. 1858. Eliza never married, and also spent most of her life, living at home, with parents and siblings. She died at age 71, on Feb. 18, 1928. She too was buried in the Lexington Cemetery, Fayette Co., Ky., in Section 15, Lot #40, near her family.

The fourth child of Amanda and William Tingle, Jr., was WILLIAM TINGLE, (III) born 20 Nov., 1859, and died Dec. 4, 1915. Please see pages 3 & 4, as he has been previously identified.

The fifth child of Amanda and William, Jr., was LAURA TINGLE, born ca. 1861, Lexington, Fayette Co., Ky. She was 9 years old in the 1870 census of Fayette County, p.340-A, of the microfilm. I have not read the 1880, 1900, 1910 or 1920 census records of this group, so I am not sure when Laura left the nest. She probably married and moved away. More research needs to be done, in marriage records, etc.....Laura was not buried in the Lexington Cemetery, However, she may have been, under her married name.

ERNEST BERNARD TINGLE, was the 6th child of Amanda & Wm. Tingle. He was born ca. 1864, Fayette County, Ky.. I have not found a marriage record, but he was listed twice, on the Deeds, Mortgages, Etc., Fayette Co., KY., in 1885 and 1892, both mortgages were between Ernest and William Tingle, Jr. For \$400.00, plus 6% interest, per annum, to purchase a grocery store, and all equipment, from house and store, located at the corner of Warnock and Goodlove, or Goodloe Streets, in Lexington, Kentucky. I think,....William Tingle, Jr., is actually the son of William Tingle, Jr., the husband of Amanda Tingle. Some of the records also show Wm. III as a junior. However, Amanda's husband was a Junior, on his death record, so he is the legal William, Jr., and their son will be identified as William III. It appears that this transaction was between brothers, but it does get confusing, and sometimes difficult to tell which is which.

Ernest Tingle died at age 82, on Feb. 28, 1946, in Lexington, Fayette Co., Kentucky. He was buried in the Lexington Cemetery, in Sec. 15, lot #40, near his siblings. 4

LEONARD TINGLE, was the 7th child of Amanda and William Tingle, Junior. Leonard was born ca. 1866, in Lexington, Fayette County, Ky. His first appearance in Kentucky records, was in 1870 census of Fayette County, at Lexington, page 340-A, on the microfilm. He was just 4 years old. I have recently learned, that Leonard married MARY GIOVANELLI.....A descendant of Leonard and Mary G. Tingle, a MR. JAN FORT, now living in California, saw my querie, in the KENTUCKY ANCESTORS, V27-2, 1991, a publication by the Kentucky Historical Society. He also took the time to send me names and telephone numbers of other members of his family, living in Kentucky and Virginia. They are now members of our Tingle Descendants.....I contacted Mrs. Amanda Herndon Wascak, a very busy, young mother, interested in researching the Tingle family. Amanda gave me the name and address of her mother, Mrs. Jean Tingle Herndon. Both ladies live in Virginia. More about this group of Tingle Descendants, later..... 12

Getting back to Leonard Tingle and his wife Mary Giovanelli. I had seen her name among the Tingles, buried in the Lexington Cemetery, and knew they were a married couple, or at least thought they were. Leonard Tingle and Mary Giovanelli Tingle were married about 1892, or before. They had at least two children, that I have identified, from cemetery records. They were; HARRY GIOVANELLI TINGLE, born ca. 1893, probably in Lexington, Fayette County Co. Ky., and LEONARD GIOVANELLI (TINGLE?), born ca. 1896..... 21

Their father, Leonard Tingle, died in November, 1910, at age 44. He was buried in the Lexington Cemetery, Section 11, lot 40. His wife, Mary Giovanelli Tingle, died in July, 1941. She was buried August 1, 1941, in Section 11, lot 40, of the Lexington Cemetery, Fayette County, Ky. She was 73 years old. Perhaps their most recent descendants will be able to give us more details about this family. 4

HARRY GIOVANELLI TINGLE, born ca. 1893, probably in Fayette Co., Ky., the (first ?) child of Leonard and Mary G. Tingle, later married LILLIAN FORT, as per Jan Fort. Mrs. Lillian Fort Tingle, is 94 years old, and still living in the Lexington, Ky. area. Harry G. Tingle and Lillian Fort Tingle, are the parents of Mrs. Jean Tingle Herndon, mentioned above, Mrs. Norris Tingle Madden, and the grandparents of Mrs. Amanda Herndon Wascak, also mentioned above.....Harry Giovanelli Tingle, died in June, 1956 and interred June 13, 1956, in Sec. 11, lot 120, Lexington Cemetery, on Main Street. 4

LEE O. TINGLE, born 1868, was the 8th child of William Tingle, Jr. and Amanda Tingle. He may have married, but he died at age 28, and was buried on Jan. 15, 1896. He was buried in Sec. J, lot 112, Lexington Cemetery, Main St., Fayette County, Ky..... The only, other record I found of him, was the 1870 census, p. 340-A, of Fayette County. He was 2 years old. 18

The 9th child of William, Jr. and Amanda Tingle, was named ALLIE TINGLE, a male child of age 5 months, in 1870. Allie was born on Dec. 20, 1869, Lexington, Fayette Co., Ky. He only lived 12 years, and was buried on Dec. 16, 1881, four days before his 12th birthday. 12

JESSIE TINGLE, infant, born and died April 26, 1886.....This male child, identified by cemetery records, was probably the grandson of William, Jr. and Amanda Tingle. Perhaps he was the child of Leonard and Mary Geovanelli Tingle.

There was also an ERNEST CARRICK TINGLE, b.ca.1909, who was buried on April 10, 1981, at age 72, in Section 15, lot 40, of the Lexington Cemetery, Main St., Lexington, KY.....Sending for his death certificate, should help to identify his parents..... The 1910 and 1920 Census enumerations, of Fayette County, Ky., should also give some clues.....He may have some descendants living in Kentucky.

My great-great-grandfather, NATHANIEL TINGLE, b. 1795, Ky., moved his family to Greenwood, Indiana, in 1855. Therefore, I stopped checking the more recent census records of this line. I'm sure, there are many new facts to be learned, from Mrs. Amanda Herndon Wascak, and other members of her family...Please Stay Tuned!!

This concludes what I have found, about Jesse Tingle and Sarah C. Plunket Tingle (Young) and their descendants.....Since JASPER TINGLE AND WIFE, had 7 sons and 2 daughters, there will be more!
