TINGLE FAMILY REUNION IN WICOMICO COUNTY, MARYLAND.

On December 11, 1994 approximately 50 Tingle descendants gathered in the parish hall of Bethel Methodist Church, Parsonsburg, Wicomico County, Maryland for their annual "get-together" and luncheon. The editor of your newsletter, and his wife, were kindly invited. To anyone who has never tasted the delectables of a Maryland Eastern Shore dinner, believe me when I say that you don't know what you missed---particularly the chicken.

Those present were descendants of George W. Tingle (1887 - 1952) and his wife, Bessie E. Quillen Tingle (1883 - 1966). The latter were parents of eight boys and one girl, three of whom are living and were present at the reunion. A TINGLE Family Tree was distributed which listed their names:

George W. Tingle was a son of Matthias W. Tingle (1856 - 1927) and his wife, Ann (Annie) L. Workman Tingle (1857 - 1937). He, in turn, was a son of Manaan Tingle (1830 - 1915) and his wife, Mary Truitt Tingle (1828 - 1897). See Vol. 4 - No. 1, pp. 18-20 of 'TINGLE DESCENDANTS'.

All of the aforementioned Tingles are of the line which starts with James Tingle of Sussex County, Delaware (1765 - 1849) and his wife, Leah Lockwood Tingle (1769 - 1850). Substantial interest has developed and has been recorded in recent issues of our newsletter regarding them. It is hoped that all this will result in documenting the father and mother of James which may carry this line directly back to Hugh Tingle, the progenitor, who came to the colony of Maryland from England in 1669.

JAMES AMOS TINGLE OF GEORGIA (1859 - 1936)  
DANIEL WHITNEY TINGLE OF GEORGIA AND VIRGINIA (1894 - 1962)  
HELEN THERESE TINGLE ADAMS OF CALIFORNIA AND VIRGINIA (1931 - )

One of the pleasures in editing this family newsletter is to receive unsolicited information and stories relating to TINGLE family history. A most recent case involves the complete background record of Mrs. Helen Tingle Adams of Newport News, Virginia. She is a faithful supporter of our newsletter.

The setting for her article originates in Monroe County, Georgia and relates to the family picture of Archibald Daniel Tingle (1835 - 1917). See Vol. 7 - No. 3, pp. 8-15 of our newsletter. That particular story stated that the picture was taken after the funeral of his wife, Mary Mahala Treadwell Tingle, in September 1909. Mrs. Adams points out this could not be true because her aunt, Mary Jane Tingle, is the little girl sitting on the lap of Martha Callie Brownlee Tingle. This child appears to be about 5 years old, which would make the date of the picture approximately 1914 instead of 1909. Miss Mary Jane Tingle, born 14 June 1909, currently lives in Jackson, Georgia. Can any Tingle descendant tell us the occasion for this picture, and the date?

Mrs. Adams is a great-granddaughter of Archibald Daniel and therefore a descendant in the seventh generation from Solomon Tingle of North Carolina (ca 1730 - 1794). Her grandfather was James Amos Tingle and her father was Daniel Whitney Tingle. Be sure to read her thumbnail sketches of immediate ancestors, and then the page titled "A couple of Whimsies". We are indebted to her for this informative history of her family and urge other correspondents to follow her example of including items of day-to-day interest when preparing stories for 'TINGLE DESCENDANTS'. A DIFFERENT "CENTERFOLD"

Some historic events seem to pique my curiosity - a case in point - to see the actual "Address of the Inhabitants of the County of Somerset - November 28, 1689", so thanks to some rules of procedure I found in the Maryland Historical Society and a trip to the Maryland State Archives in Annapolis, I was able to acquire a photocopy of this imposing document eventually from the Public Record Office in England. In brief, it was a testimonial and plea to King William (formerly of Hanover) and Queen Mary, who had been recently invited to share the throne of England.

However, there were rumblings of war between England and France reaching the Colonies over sea trade and religion, and in the "province" of Maryland, especially the Eastern Shore counties, religious tolerances were greatly strained. As those colonists were mainly Protestant, they wished to assure themselves of the Crown's protection in all phases of their lives -- hence, this address to the English rulers.

Upon receipt of the document and noting Hugh Tingle's signature thereon, as he was the progenitor who arrived in Maryland in 1669, I wanted to share this bit of history with the TINGLE DESCENDANTS membership, an event which took place nearly 305 years ago! (Julian calendar)
